The Gulf Research Center (GRC), in collaboration with the Institute for Strategic and Regional Studies under the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan (ISRS), organized the first Think Tank Forum between the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states and the Central Asian countries, under the theme "Strengthening the Strategic Partnership between the GCC and Central Asian Countries: From Historical Ties to Comprehensive Cooperation," on April 28–29, 2025, in Tashkent, Republic of Uzbekistan. The forum was organized in preparation for the upcoming GCC-Central Asia Heads of State Summit, scheduled to be held in Samarkand in May.

The forum brought together numerous research centers from both sides, as well as Gulf ambassadors and diplomats accredited to Central Asian countries, along with the participation of the Deputy Foreign Minister of the Republic of Uzbekistan, researchers, interested experts, and media representatives. The opening session, held on April 28, 2025, featured remarks from the organizers. **Dr. Abdulaziz Sager**, Chairman of the Gulf Research Center (GRC), delivered a speech welcoming the participants and attendees, highlighting the key areas of cooperation between the two sides in the political, economic, security, and cultural fields. He also expressed his appreciation to the Secretariat General of the GCC and the Ministries of Foreign Affairs of the GCC member states, acknowledging their efforts to advance relations between the GCC and Central Asian countries across all domains.



The opening session also included speeches by **Dr. Eldor Aripov**, Former Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan and Director of the Institute for Strategic and Regional Studies; **Dr. Bahrom Alov**, First Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan; and **Dr. Wejdan Fahad**, Head of the Arab and Islamic Organizations Department, Political Affairs Sector at the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC).



The forum's sessions focused on:

1. Political and Security Dialogue
2. Economic Cooperation and Investment Opportunities
3. Cultural and Humanitarian Cooperation and Development

There was a shared recognition of the need to build on this legacy by expanding collaboration across a range of sectors, including political dialogue, economic integration, energy, and cultural exchange.

A strong focus was placed on enhancing regional and international security cooperation. Delegates expressed a united commitment to jointly address shared threats such as terrorism, extremism, cyber



insecurity, and organized crime, through closer political coordination and intelligence exchange. On the economic front, the Forum underlined the vast potential to increase trade volumes, diversify investment flows, and pursue joint projects in key sectors like infrastructure, agriculture, technology, and logistics. The development of new transport corridors linking Central Asia and the Gulf was highlighted as a strategic priority to enhance both regions' roles in global supply chains.

The participants also prioritized energy cooperation, especially in renewable energy, green hydrogen, and sustainable development. There was strong support for accelerating the green transition and adopting innovative technologies. Equally important was the affirmation of cultural and humanitarian ties, with

calls to expand educational and scientific exchanges, promote tourism, and invest in preserving shared cultural heritage. Empowering youth and fostering innovation were identified as central to the long-term partnership.

Looking ahead, participants welcomed the upcoming Second Central Asia–GCC Summit in Samarkand and proposed including in its outcomes a recommendation to formalize the Forum of Analytical Centers as a regular fixture. The creation of a permanent platform for policy dialogue and joint initiatives among think tanks was endorsed, and it was announced that Saudi Arabia will host the next edition of the Forum. The Tashkent gathering thus laid the groundwork for a more structured and forward-looking strategic partnership between Central Asia and the GCC.





The Founding Conference of the Global South NGO Platform

Baku, Azerbaijan

27-30 April 2025

Dr. Mohamed Abdelraouf, Sustainability Research Program Director at the Gulf Research Center participated in the Founding Conference of the Global South NGO Platform, held in Baku, Azerbaijan, from 27-30 April 2025. The meeting gathered NGOs from 116 countries—marking a historic moment for civil society and the international community from the Global South.

The meeting covered the new network structure, its vision and goals, and interim preparations as well as coordinated NGO positions in preparation for COP30 scheduled to be held next November in Brazil.

The meeting also addressed strengthening the role of civil society NGOs on climate change and sustainable development issues, particularly in countries of the Global South, including the Middle East and Africa.





Webinar on the Preparations for OEWG 3.2 titled “Major Groups Engagement Modalities in The Science-Policy Panel (SPP) on Chemicals, Waste, and Pollution Prevention”

On 23 April 2025, 14:00 to 16:30 Riyadh time, The Gulf Research Center Foundation together with UN Environment and the Major Groups Facilitating Committee (MGFC) at UNEP co-organized a preparatory webinar for the global major groups and stakeholders on the way to OEWG 3.2 for a Science-Policy Panel on Chemicals, Waste, and Pollution.

Dr. Mohamed Abdelraouf, Sustainability Research Program Director at the Gulf Research Center delivered opening remarks, welcoming all speakers and attendees, emphasizing the importance of this very timely webinar ahead of the third session of the open-ended working group (OEWG 3.2) and intergovernmental meeting, which will take place in Punta del Este, Uruguay, from 14 to 20 June 2025.

He highlighted that chemicals, waste, and pollution are among the most pressing global environmental challenges of our time, bearing significant health, ecological, economic, and social impacts.

Ms. Gudi Alkemade (of the Netherlands), Chair of the Open-Ended Working Group (OEWG), bureau of the ad

hoc open-ended working group on a science-policy panel to contribute further to the sound management of chemicals and waste and to prevent pollution, highlighted the importance of this last round of negotiation with the aim to establish the science policy panel. She presented the history and current status of negotiations as well as the hot topics on the table for this final round of negotiations.

Ms. Tessa Goverse, Principal Coordinator, Secretariat of the ad hoc open-ended working group on a science-policy panel to contribute further to the sound management of chemicals and waste and to prevent pollution emphasized the need for a Science-Policy Panel (SPP) that is scientifically rigorous, independent, and inclusive and that the next round of negotiations will finalize the foundational document and rules of procedures.

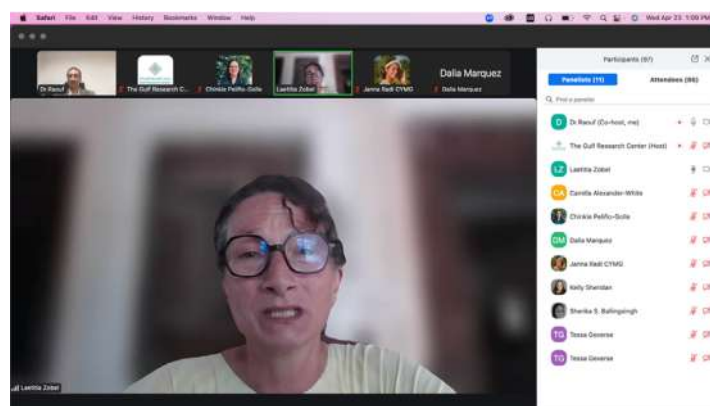

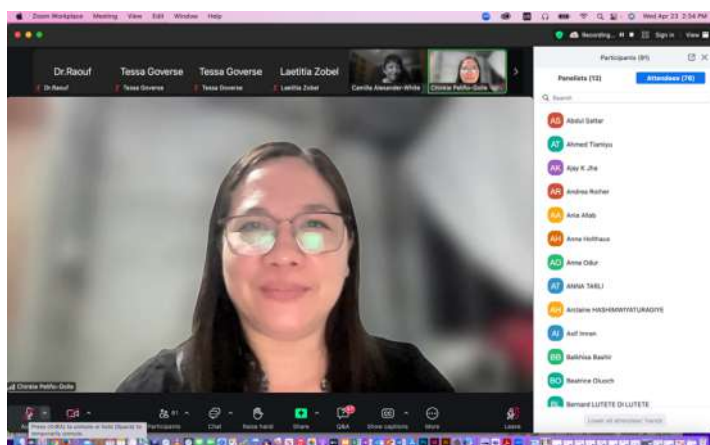
Each of the nine major groups and UNEP regions presented their views on foundational documents, rules and procedures, and engagement modalities of major groups in the panel.

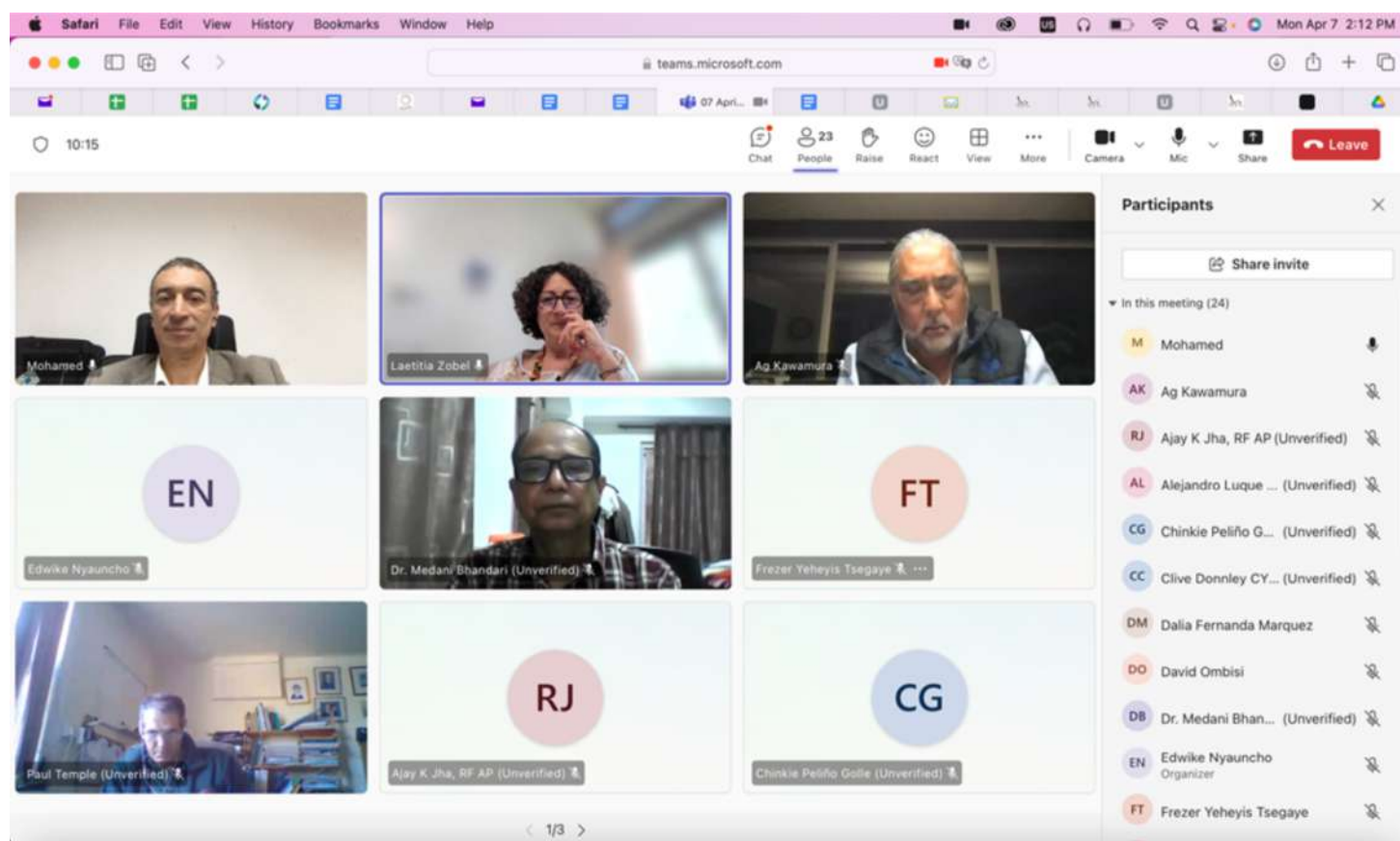


Environmental Security and Sustainability Program

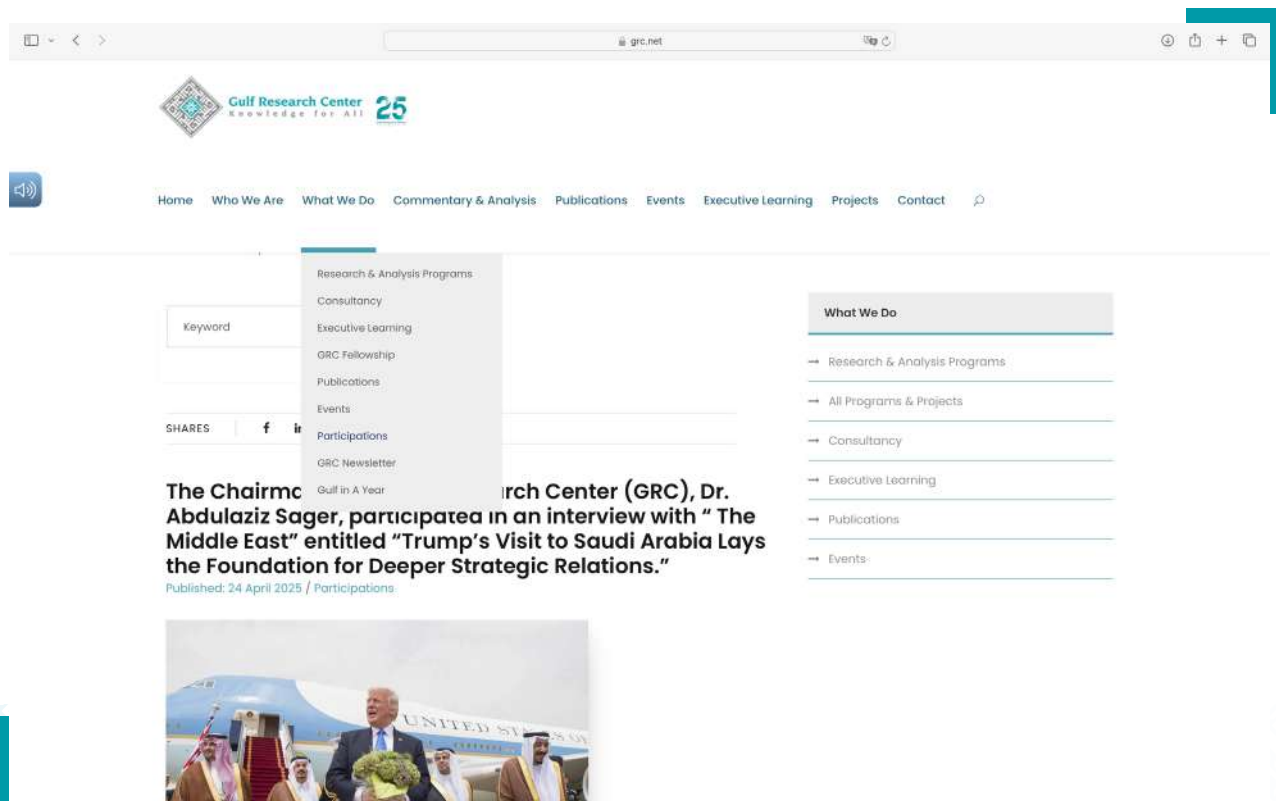
